
PROPELLING AUTOMOBILES WITHOUT USING PETROL OR GASOLINE

An automobile is propelled by a horse pushing from behind. A U-shaped member is attached by its free ends to the automobile, the automobile pulling a trailer in which food for the horse can be placed. The horse is connected to the U-shaped member in such a way that it can only reach the food by pushing against the U-shaped member and so propelling the automobile. The accelerator of the automobile can be connected to pneumatic cylinders in the ends of the U-shaped member to influence the thrust of the horse. The ignition switch can

also be arranged to give a mild shock to the posterior of the horse when it is switched on. The brake pedal maybe linked by cables to halter around the neck of the horse.

The ignition switch can also be arranged to give a mild electric shock to the posterior of the horse when it is switched on. The brake pedal maybe linked by cables to halter around the neck of the horse. In a modification, the horse is placed inside two rotating assemblies in the manner of a treadmill. Each assembly has two wheels one inside the other, with a free-wheel arrangement between the two to enable the horse to rest, e.g., when the automobile is running downhill.



Just what are Gebrauchsmuster? The term in Germany and Austria designates Utility Models, also known as: Brevet de courte durée/Octrooi van korte duur (Belgium), Brugsmødel (Denmark), Modelo de utilidad (Spain), Hyödyllisyysmalli/Nyttighetsmodell (Finland), Certificat d'utilité (France), Short-term patent (Ireland), Brevetto per modelli di utilità (Italy), Zesjarig octrooi (Netherlands) or Modelo de utilidade

(Portugal). Also called "petty patents" or "petite patents" they are also widespread in South America and Asia.

Advantages of utility models are low cost and quick registration since there is no examination for novelty due to a lower standard for inventiveness and industrial applicability. An opposition process allows utility models to be invalidated. The term is only for 4–10 years, useful for temporary protection of a product while the patent is pending. They are not the same as Design Patents, which cover only the decorative features of a product.

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

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
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Dolls formed in the likeness of the Lord Jesus with a movable head and extremities

A doll formed in the likeness of the Lord Jesus with a movable head and extremities comprised of a torso section including a loin cloth molded into its lower portion and a pair of movable leg sections. The lower ends of the leg sections have a pair of feet sections secured thereto. A pair of arm sections are secured to the torso section. A pair of hand sections are secured to the lower ends of the arm sections. A head section is secured to the upper end of the torso section.

The doll is provided with electrically conductive nails which when inserted through apertures in the hands of the doll, mount the doll to a provided cross and close an electrical circuit which illuminates the cross.

A multi-piece image of female creation that can be used as toy, archetypal image, educational device or therapeutic aid. The image is made up of a human-like female form together with forms which depict the non-human elements of creation of a particular creation myth.

The female form may comprise a rigid statue, with a womb-like cavity in its abdomen, with an opening thereto between the legs of the female form. Alternatively, the female form may be a soft figure such as stuffed doll, with an expandable torso and cavity achieved, for example, by pleating or gathering.

The female form may be provided with pre-made forms of the elements of the creation, or with material and instructions or patterns for these forms.

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

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

The present invention discloses a resilient headband arcuate in shape for being mounted on the head of the user. Vehicular impact signaling device


An apparatus for the deployment of a visible plume to alert other motorists that a proximate motor vehicle has been involved in a collision is described as having a tube which is open at one end disposed at the top and closed at a distal end. The distal end houses an activation device that is used to detonate an explosive charge in response to the detection of an output signal.

The output signal is generated by a sensor subsequent to the motor vehicle experiencing an impact of

sufficient magnitude. Both the sensor and the output signal are compatible with current technologies used to detect impacts which result in the deployment of air bags, and accordingly the device may rely upon these systems as may already be installed in the motor vehicle.

The explosive charge expels a signaling media above the motor vehicle in a plume above the motor vehicle to visually alert other motorists that a collision has occurred. The plume rises to a preferred height of approximately 60 feet, making it readily visible to the other motorists in the area.

The signaling media includes a powder, liquid, or pyrotechnic device. The pyrotechnic device produces a momentary highly visible flare. An audible signal is generated by incorporating an explosive pyrotechnic device, such as a firecracker, within the signaling media.

Hair restoring method and apparatus for carrying out the same

A hair restoring apparatus comprises a helmet-like cap having a sealing ring formed around a brim portion into which compressed air is supplied, and provided with an air inlet/outlet, steam inlets and hair restorer inlets. A pneumatic machine is connected to the air inlet/outlet of the cap and to the sealing ring formed around the brim portion of the cap by way of pipes, a steam generator is connected to the steam inlets of the cap by way of pipes, and a hair restorer supply unit for storing a hair restorer is connected to the hair restorer inlets of the cap by way of pipes.

The cap is put on the head to form a sealed space between the cap and the head, steam is jetted into the sealed space after evacuating the latter to expand and to clean portions of the scalp around hair roots, a hair restorer is jetted into the evacuated, sealed space, and then compressed air is jetted into the sealed space to promote the penetration of the hair restorer into the portions of the scalp around hair roots.





Additional features include elastics tinted in bright colors, optional use with either the right or the left hand and convenience, since no missiles are necessary given that the insect is smitten with the actual elastic band.

Method and apparatus for making a drink hop along a bar or counter


